The gathering brought together community members, police Chief Balderrama, Mayor Jerry Dyer, City Attorney Andrew Janz, and many other city leaders. The gathering served as a platform for the Aspen Meadow neighborhood to voice their concerns, share experiences and successes, discuss safety improvements, and outline the necessary steps for a safer community.

The primary focus of the meeting was to provide a forum for the community to express their concerns. Chief Balderrama acknowledged the need for more of a police presence and pledged increased resources to the area. Jog-a-thon and Lunch on the Lawn (October 31st): On the spooktacular day of October 31st, we're hosting our annual Jog-a-thon. This event is not just for our students; we extend a warm invitation to you, our dedicated parents, to join us on the green lawns of our school. Watch as your little athletes run laps, and after the race, we'll share lunch together. We also encourage parents to step up as volunteers to make this day memorable. Our iReady program is another valuable tool we use to monitor students' growth in reading and math. The December diagnostic tests begin on December 4th. As these tests reveal what our students have learned, we encourage you to support your child in excelling by ensuring they get ample sleep, eat a hearty breakfast, read each question carefully, and use scratch paper to work through problems.
